## SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

Summer school will begin Monday, June 28th, at Hugo Owens Middle School for students in grades 9-12.

Information on course offerings and the cost for Summer School 2010 will be available beginning May 3rd from the Guidance Department. Summer school flyers are available in the Guidance Department. In order to register for summer school, students must pay first. Students should bring payment to the Guidance Department before school and during first block (8:00 am - 10:00 am) and during lunch (12:00 – 2:00 pm). Checks (payable to Deep Creek High School) and cash will be accepted May 4 – May 29. CASH only from June 1 – 17.

This year summer school will be held Monday – Thursday from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. Schools will be closed on Friday. Limited transportation will be provided. Minimum enrollment must be met for a class to be offered. Students may register

at the Summer School Office located at Owens Middle School from June 21-24. In order to register, students must have a registration form from the DCHS Guidance Department. Please see your counselor for a registration form before June 17<sup>th</sup>.

## SUMMER SCHOOL DRIVER EDUCATION

Classroom Only or Full Course: All students needing to take classroom only or full course (classroom, simulator, range, and road test) during summer school will sign up and pay the Guidance Department.

Simulator, Range and Road Tests: All students needing to take the Simulator, Range and Road Test must sign up with Coach Noblin during the week of May 17<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> during their lunch period. Coach Noblin will have a table set up in the cafeteria all week during all lunches. Students will need to bring a check made payable to DCHS or cash in the amount of \$150 and a parent permission form (can be picked up from the simulator door). All students will be assigned days and times for the summer.

Note: Beginning in September, 2010, students taking the road test will be subject to a fee of \$200.
