The Grassfield High School Class of 2017 is the tenth graduating class of Grizzly alumni. The graduation ceremony will be held on Fri, June 16, at 12:45 pm at the ODU Ted Constant Convocation

Graduation Tickets

Each senior will receive 10 tickets for the graduation ceremony. Tickets are required for admission. If special circumstances exist, graduates may request additional tickets by submitting a written request to Ms. Laura Agudelo prior to **Thursday, June 1**. Seniors should deliver notes to the main office, please ensure that the senior's (first and last) name is included on the note and that you specify how many additional tickets you are requesting. All tickets will be distributed to seniors on **Monday, June 12th** during the senior class meeting.

Sample note requesting extra graduation tickets (please write legibly):

(by requesting 5 additional tickets, the senior will receive a total of 15 tickets (the 10 she'll automatically receive + 5 additional tickets)



All graduates will refrain from wearing distracting jewelry with their caps and gowns. **Graduates will not be allowed to carry cell phones, purses, water bottles, flowers, or any other personal items into the ceremony. All personal items must be placed in your own labeled, clear Ziploc bag with your name on it and may be picked up after the ceremony.**

Please do not bring gift bags or boxes, camera bags, large objects, containers, noisemakers, balloons, or signs. These items are not allowed in the Convocation Center. Cell phones must be turned off or placed on vibrate.

What Should You Wear?

Caps and gowns must be worn for graduation. Grassfield graduates wear red caps and gowns with red, white, and navy tassels. Honor graduates will wear white honor stoles and white tassels. Caps are worn with the cap and mortarboard parallel to the ground – not tilted. The tassel is worn over the right eye; once all diplomas are awarded, the class president will lead the seniors in changing the tassel to the left to signify the entire class of 2017 has graduated.

In addition to the cap and gown, graduating young men

will dress in trousers (no jeans), collared dress shirts, neckties, socks, and appropriate shoes (no sneakers or flip-flops).

In addition to the cap and gown, graduating young ladies will wear appropriate dress and shoes (no sneakers or flip-flops). We highly recommend low heel shoes with backs, as it is very difficult to navigate the steps and stage in very high heels or backless shoes.

Any graduating senior who has not purchased a cap and gown may do so by calling Balfour at 420-2233 to make arrangements. These caps and gowns were distributed at the Senior Assembly on **April 26th**.

Balfour was back on the 27th during all four lunches for honor students to purchase honor stoles for \$15.00 (CASH ONLY) and to exchange their red, white, & blue tassels for white ones.

Balfour will be back for any last minute needs at 8:45 a.m. on Tuesday, June 13th.

2017 Baccalaureate Service

The City-Wide Baccalaureate Committee has requested that we share that the Baccalaureate Service for the Class of 2017 will be held on **Sunday, June 11 at 4 p.m.** at Oscar Smith High School in

the auditorium. This non-denominational service is being sponsored by a community group comprised of parents and students. Seniors will wear their own cap and gown for the ceremony. Seniors

should plan to arrive in their cap and gown at 3:30. This year, five \$100 prizes will be awarded to five individual seniors in attendance!

Directions and Parking Information for Old Dominion University:

There are meters and parking garages on both 43rd Street and 45th Street near the Convocation Center. Parking lot entrance and exit lanes, as well as handicapped parking areas, are clearly marked. A drop-off area is available for those guests needing special assistance. There will be no fee charged for the use of the parking garages, however any metered parking near the venue will require fees as listed. Please make sure you check the signs posted!

Graduates will enter the Ted Constant Center through the 43rd Street entrance into the Monarch Room. Graduates must be in the Monarch Room on the day of graduation (June 16) no later than 11:30 a.m.

All guests will enter through the Hampton Boulevard entrances. Doors will open for guests at 11:45 a.m.




Appropriate attire for guests attending the graduation is requested. Appropriate dress includes dress pants and shirts for the gentlemen; dresses, suits or pantsuits for the ladies. Admission will be denied to guests who are inappropriately dressed.

Scholarships and Slide Show Recognition

Seniors who have received scholarships and wish to have them acknowledged in the printed graduation program must submit documentation to Mrs. Julie Freeman in the Career Center no later than **May 5**. Mrs. Freeman will, however, continue to receive this information after the May 6 deadline (*information submitted after the deadline will not appear in the slide show or graduation program*).

A slide-show is planned for broadcast at school and at graduation prior to the ceremony. For Seniors to be acknowledged, they must fill out the [online Fall 2017 commitments form](#) by **May 19**. [All commitments represent the graduate's post high school plans and include *all* college/universities, trade programs, military enlistments, etc.]

Remember, each family would like to hear their own student's name called without interference. Please refrain from loud outbursts when names are called.



The Graduation Ceremony will be broadcasted live online!

The graduation ceremony will be available live on CPS-TV (46 on Cox and 42 on Verizon FIOS) and streaming over the Internet from the Chesapeake Public Schools homepage. On the right side of the page, there is a section labeled "Broadcasting Media." The second entity listed is "WCPS TV Station." Next to that is the link

labeled "Watch." If you click that link, you can watch the live stream of the graduation ceremony. It will air at the same time the graduation is scheduled.
