The support that was demonstrated by you in the days that followed was greatly appreciated and helped restore a sense of calm on our campus. As always, we are reviewing our procedures to make sure they offer the safest possible setting for our students. We welcome your input and suggestions.

International Baccalaureate



The IB Mission Statement emphasizes that the IB Program "aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect."

Interested eighth graders who reside in Chesapeake apply for the Diploma Program by applying for the Pre-IB Academy at Oscar F. Smith High School. **The application deadline is January 15.** Fifty applicants are accepted each year for the four-year program. Pre-IB Academy instruction consists of intensified courses in Grades 9 and 10 in English, Spanish or French, social studies, science, and mathematics in preparation for the rigorous college-level curriculum of the Grade 11-12 Diploma Program. IB students have the opportunity to earn the International Baccalaureate diploma in addition to the Virginia Advanced Studies Diploma.

Students accepted for the IB Program receive all instruction for the four years of the program at Oscar F. Smith High School and are eligible for all Virginia High School League sports and other extra-curricular activities only at Oscar F. Smith High School. For IB students, daily busing is provided to the school from all areas of the city.

AVID – Advancement Via Individual Determination

AVID is celebrating 30 years of innovation and transformation of students and Oscar Smith is celebrating having

the program provide passion for its students for the second year.

As students begin scheduling for next year, the AVID program is actively seeking students who are interested in making their college dreams a reality.

The AVID Student

AVID targets students in the academic middle – B and C students- who have the desire to go to college and the willingness to work hard. These are students who are capable of completing rigorous curriculum. Typically, they may be the first in their families to attend college, and many are from socio-economic classes who are underserved at the college level. AVID pulls these students out of their unchallenging courses and puts them on the college track: acceleration instead of remediation.

The AVID Elective

Not only are students enrolled in their school's toughest classes, such as honors and Advanced Placement®, but also in the AVID elective. For one period a day, students learn organizational and study skills, work on critical thinking and asking probing questions, get academic help from peers and college tutors, and participate in enrichment and motivational activities that make college seem attainable. AVID students become academically successful leaders and role models for other students.

The AVID Curriculum

The AVID curriculum, based on rigorous standards, was developed by middle and senior high school teachers in collaboration with college professors. It is driven by the WICR method, which stands for writing, inquiry, collaboration, and reading. AVID curriculum is used in AVID elective classes, in content-area classes in AVID schools, and even in schools where the AVID elective is not offered.

- Medication **CANNOT** be left in the clinic over the summer.

- Anything left over will be discarded per regulations before the clinic closes for the summer. **The clinic closes June 17.**
- Medication orders must be renewed each school year. Summer is a great time to take care of this matter in preparation for September.
- Medication forms are available in the clinic. Blank forms will be sent home with any student who takes routine daily medication. Forms may be downloaded from the Chesapeake Public Schools website. Please remember to update **ASTHMA ACTION PLANS** and **ALLERGY ACTION PLANS** with the physician over the summer for next school year. Warm Weather Safety Tips

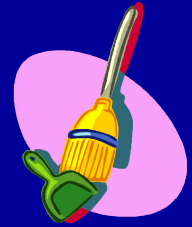
- Protect yourself from the harmful rays of the sun. Use sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15.
- Stay well-hydrated with plenty of water.
- Never dive in shallow water or unknown water levels and follow all safety rules at pools.
- Never swim alone. Swim in areas where lifeguards are on duty.
- Avoid use of alcohol, tobacco products and illegal substances.

- Drive without distractions such as other teenagers who may urge the driver to speed or practice other reckless behaviors.
- Do not talk or text on a cell phone while driving.

- Be sure you are well rested when you drive.
- If you are prone to becoming angry, participate in anger management groups or other programs that will equip you to deal with the stress of driving without "road rage".
- Do not engage in racing other drivers.
- Do not speed.
- Buckle up every time you drive or ride in a car. Maintain a safe following distance and anticipate problems that lie ahead.

Spring Cleaning

With the arrival of spring it's often not just our homes that need a spring cleaning, but our laptop or desktop computers. To ensure your computer is running as fast as it can and to eliminate any potential bugs/viruses, remember to follow through on the following:



1. *De-fragment*: This process is used in computers running Microsoft Windows and re-arranges the space on your hard disk so it can run more efficiently.
2. *Disk Clean up*: This is another Microsoft product designed to speed up your computer. If you run the disk clean up application, it will identify unused files on your drive that can be deleted so your computer operates at its peak.
3. *Anti-virus*: Most computers come with anti-virus software installed, but few realize that this software must be updated. Check to make sure you have the latest and greatest; if not, buy an upgrade to keep you from having major issues later.
4. *Upgrade RAM*: Most computers are sold with less RAM than they can accommodate; if you want to speed up your computer, adding additional RAM is an easy and cost-effective route. There are multiple websites that sell RAM and will scan your computer to see which type it accepts, or you can take it to a local electronics store for assistance.

Prevent tick-borne diseases by:

- walking in the center of established trails; avoiding overgrown grass, brush and leaf litter
- dressing appropriately in wooded areas including long-sleeved shirts and long pants to help keep ticks off your skin
- wearing light colored clothing so that ticks are easier to see and remove
- tucking pant legs into socks and tucking shirt into pants, taping around the top of socks where they meet pants and pre-treating clothes with 0.5% permethrin
- wearing tick repellent
- using tick repellent products on pets per your veterinarian's recommendation
- frequently checking for ticks and properly removing ticks as soon as they are found with fine-tipped tweezers by grasping the tick as close to the skin as possible and pulling upward with steady, even pressure followed by application of antiseptic to the bite site and washing hands with soap and water
- disposing of ticks by drowning in alcohol or flushing down a toilet or drain.

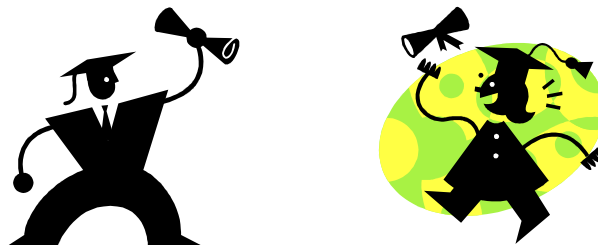
- May 14, 2010:** All financial obligations should be cleared by noon. This includes all media fines, all club obligations, textbooks, sports equipment, etc. Failure to pay financial obligations will prohibit you from participating in the graduation practice and ceremony.
- June 2 and 3, 2010:** Cap and gown delivery during all lunches in the senior dining room. Any unpaid balance must be paid in cash at this time. **All financial obligations must be cleared before practice. You must practice to participate in the graduation ceremony!!!!!!**
- June 16, 2010:** Graduation practice at 1 pm. Students must be in the gymnasium at that time. They are not allowed to wander the building. Food, drinks, or guests are not allowed in practice. The school dress code must be followed. Cell phones are not allowed. Students should be prepared to stay until released. **We will practice until it is right!**
- June 17, 2010:** **Graduation Day!** Students must be in the gym no later than 3:45 pm. The class picture will be taken at 4:00 pm. Students are to arrive, dressed in cap and gown and ready for graduation. Please do not bring guests, food, drinks, purses, cell phones, or anything else. Cell phones and other items will be confiscated, and you will have to make arrangements to retrieve those items the week after graduation. **The buses will depart for ODU at 6:15 pm. Graduation is at 8 pm.** You must ride the bus to the Ted Constant Center for the graduation ceremony.
Transportation back to Oscar Smith after graduation is not provided.

Graduation Dress

- Ladies:** White knee-length dresses (dresses must meet the school dress code – no spaghetti straps, strapless, or backless dresses, no skirts and blouses), white heels or dressy white flats (no sandals, no clogs, no open toe shoes, shoes must have a back), white hose, white cap and gown, tassel.

Extenuating Circumstances

A student who has passed any class academically but has failed to meet the attendance requirements may be eligible to apply for extenuating circumstances. A candidate for extenuating circumstances must be able to provide the following to verify the reason for the extended days absences.

- Evidence of attendance for the maximum number of days possible in the extended day program.
- Notes from a doctor
- Subpoenas from court
- Notice of a death in the immediate family.

Evidence of attendance for the maximum number of days possible in the extended day program for each class for which extenuating circumstances is needed. Days are earned back through the extended day program by spending time in the extended day program. The maximum number of days in the extended day program that may be earned are listed below:

- 1 credit course: 2 days earned in the extended day program
- 2 credit course: 4 days earned in the extended day program

A student requesting extenuating circumstances will make application to Mr. Dugan. Applications may be picked up in the main office. Applications should be completed and signed by the student, the teacher of each class that the student is asking for extenuating circumstances in, and a parent. It is the responsibility of the student to return the completed form and all supporting documentation to Mr. Dugan before the announced deadline. If there is documentation in question or clarification needed, an appointment will be scheduled after school hours to accommodate parents and minimize interruption of instructional time. Once the process is completed, the teachers will be notified as to whether extenuating circumstances has been granted or denied.

Parents are encouraged to arrange doctors' appointments before or after school hours, when possible.
