**GUIDE TO MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAMS 2017**

**GENERAL INFORMATION**

The middle school summer school classes will be offered at **Indian River Middle School**. **Classes will be held 8:00 a.m. – 12:45 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. Schools will be closed on Fridays and on Tuesday, July 4, 2017. Students must be enrolled in grades 6-8 during the 2016-2017 school year in order to attend. Core academic classes are offered during ten-day sessions. Enrichment classes are offered during an eight-day session. **All classes are dependent on sufficient enrollment and the availability of qualified and appropriately endorsed instructional staff.**

**REGISTRATION**

Registration forms will be available in the school counseling office of each middle school beginning in April. **CPS students may register and pay for summer school courses beginning April 24, 2017**. Completed registration forms should be signed by a school counselor. **Registration for enrichment classes should be completed by May 19, 2017**. Registration for all other middle school classes should be completed by Tuesday, June 13, 2017, at each student's home school. Registration will also be held at Indian River Middle School beginning Tuesday, June 20, 2017, for students who need to take a repeat course. Early registration is strongly encouraged.

**ATTENDANCE**

Regular student attendance is expected during summer school sessions. Attendance and tardy regulations will apply to summer school students. As during the regular school year, schools are governed by school board policy that requires the student to attend the current session for a minimum number of days. If the student fails to meet these requirements, he or she may not receive a passing grade for that session. For middle school ten-day class sessions, this requirement means that **a student cannot miss more than two days**. Students will not be excused to leave summer school early for vacation.

**STUDENT CONDUCT**

Appropriate student conduct is vital to ensuring a safe, orderly learning environment. Student conduct and policy guidelines for the 2016-2017 school year will remain in effect during all summer school sessions. Since participation in summer school is not mandatory, students who present discipline problems while in transit to or from school, at bus stops, or while on school grounds are subject to disciplinary action. Students who present discipline problems will not be allowed to continue attendance.

**PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS – CHESAPEAKE RESIDENTS**

Private school and home-schooled students may only enroll in middle school enrichment courses. Registration for private and home-schooled students will occur during the week of May 15-19, 2017, at Indian River Middle School. Parents should provide proof of residency and a check or money order for the program fee at the time of enrollment.

**TUITION**

Ten-day core classes, special education, and ESL classes are free to all Chesapeake Public School students. Middle school enrichment classes are \$150.00 per student participant. Reduced rates of \$75.00 and \$100.00 are available for students who have been determined eligible for free or reduced meals during the regular school year. Payment in full is due at the time of registration. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the student's home school. Online School Payment (OSP) will also be accepted for CPS students. **No refunds will be issued after June 1, 2017.**

**TRANSPORTATION**

Bus transportation will be provided for summer school students. Transportation will be limited and will likely be a designated neighborhood pick-up point. Specific bus schedules for all schools can be viewed on the Summer School section of Chesapeake Public Schools website beginning one week prior to summer school. Bus routes will be updated one week before the start of the second session.

**MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAMS**

**Repeat Classes (Ten-Day Class)**

Middle school repeat classes are offered to sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students who need to repeat academic classes necessary for promotion to the next grade level. Repeat classes are offered for the core subject areas of English, mathematics, science, and social studies. Each class will meet for ten days. A student may take a maximum of two repeat classes during the summer; however, only one class per session may be taken. To be eligible to repeat a class, a student must have made an "E" in the course during the 2016-2017 school year. A student who made a "D" in the course must have permission from his or her school principal. The final decision on student eligibility for a repeat course is made by the home school principal.

### **Algebra ACCESS (Ten-Day Class)**

Algebra ACCESS (*Algebraic Concepts Covered Extensively in Summer School*) is a non-credit bearing class for current sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students who have not completed Algebra I but who are interested in strengthening their current knowledge base and pursuing advanced math courses in high school. Students will review pre-algebra skills and be afforded opportunities to gain exposure to algebraic concepts designed to help develop the mathematical concepts needed to be successful in Algebra I. Students enrolled in this class must have successfully completed Honors Math 6, Pre Algebra 6, Pre Algebra 7 or Pre-Algebra 8. This class will be offered during Session 1 and Session 2; however, a student may only take the class one time. A pass/fail grade will be earned for this class.

### **MIDDLE SCHOOL ENRICHMENT (Eight-Day Class)**

Middle School Summer Enrichment classes are designed for students in grades six through eight who are working on or above grade level. Students may enroll in one of three enrichment classes. Enrichment classes are open to all Chesapeake residents; however, registration and payment must be received by Friday, May 19, 2017. Classes are \$150.00 per student participant. Reduced rates are available for students who have been determined eligible for free/reduced meals during the regular school year.

### **Robotic Systems and Design**

This course will provide opportunities for middle school students to engage in hands-on activities related to robotics engineering. Students will use Lego Robotics to design, assemble, program, and test a robot capable of performing a specified task. Higher level problem solving skills will be used to integrate science, math and technology standards throughout the course.

### **Basic Game Design**

This course will provide opportunities to learn basic programming concepts. Students will learn about basic electrical circuits used in game controller design. After exploring the topics of logic and electrical theory, students will study programming concepts through visual programming applications. By the end of the eight-day course, students will collaboratively build a classic video game and construct a controller for it.

### **Digital Designs**

Students enrolled in this course will explore the creative uses of technology. Students will learn about various ways to edit and enhance digital media. The use of digital photography, video, and editing will be among the topics explored through hands-on activities.

## **OTHER PROGRAMS**

### **Special Education**

***Monday, June 26, 2017 – Thursday, July 20, 2017***

The Summer Special Education Program is for students who currently receive special education services and were recommended for the program by their teacher. The program is designed to maintain the student's skill development. Space in this program is limited.

### **English Learners (EL)**

***Monday, June 26, 2017 – Thursday, July 20, 2017***

The EL program is designed for students in grades six through eight who are in the process of learning English as a second language and whose proficiency levels are 1, 2, 3 or 4. Students will work in small groups to expand vocabulary and to improve their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. World Class Instructional Design and Assessment (WIDA) standards will be covered.

### **Bridge to Algebra (781BRAL)**

***Monday, July 17, 2017 – Tuesday, August 15, 2017***

This is a non-credit bearing class designed for rising ninth grade students who are scheduled to take Algebra Foundations or Algebra I Part A in the fall. Participation is by invitation only. Criteria used to select students for Bridge to Algebra include current math grades, SOL scores, attendance, and military connection. Students will report to Indian River High School for this class.
