

# INDIAN RIVER HIGH SCHOOL - SUMMER SCHOOL - 2008

(Neighborhood transportation services to these classes are offered to students who attend Oscar Smith High School and Indian River High School during the regular school year. Students who reside outside of the Oscar Smith High and Indian River High area and are attending the single-section, citywide classes must ride the express bus.) **Fees for Chesapeake residents are \$67.50 for four-week classes and \$135.00 for eight-week classes. # CHESAPEAKE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

## 2008 SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

### BASIC INFORMATION

Summer school will begin Monday, June 23, 2008 for students in grades 6-12. Courses are designed for eighteen or thirty-six days. The complete schedule is listed on the back of this page.

Students who attend Great Bridge High, Hickory High, and Great Bridge Middle, and Hickory Middle will attend **Hickory Middle School**. Students who attend Grassfield High and live east of Dominion Blvd. will attend **Hickory Middle School**. Students who attend Grassfield High and live on Dominion or west of Dominion will attend **Deep Creek High**. Students who attend Oscar Smith High and Indian River High will attend **Indian River High School**. Students who attend Jolliff Middle and Western Branch Middle will attend **Jolliff Middle School**. Students who attend Deep Creek Middle and Hugo Owens Middle will attend **Deep Creek Middle School**. Students who attend Western Branch High, and Deep Creek High, and some students who attend Grassfield High will attend **Deep Creek High School**. Students who attend Indian River Middle and Crestwood Middle will attend **Indian River Middle School**. Students who attend Greenbrier Middle and Oscar Smith Middle will attend **Greenbrier Middle School**. There are several courses that have only one class for the entire city. These courses are offered at **Indian River High School**.

Classes meet 8:00-12:00 each weekday, July 4 will be observed as a holiday; therefore, schools will be closed. Schools will also be closed on July 18 for a semester break. Graduation for all three summer school centers will be held August 13, 2008 at 7:30 p.m. in the Indian River High School auditorium.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL COURSES

Students who need courses in sixth, seventh, or eighth-grade English, mathematics, science, or social studies may take the courses at no cost, if the students are Chesapeake residents. Non-Chesapeake residents will be charged \$160 per course. Each sixth, seventh, or eighth-grade class will meet for eighteen days. A student may take two courses if permission is obtained from his or her principal. To be eligible to take a sixth, seventh, or eighth-grade class, a student must have made an "E." A student who earned a "D" must have the permission of his or her school principal.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S GIFTED AND ENRICHMENT SERIES

Programs designed to give middle and high school students an opportunity to learn new skills and explore new areas of interest are offered. See the Superintendent's Gifted and Enrichment series bulletin for information on cost, times, locations, and bus schedules. Bulletins are available in all secondary schools.

### CREDIT-BEARING COURSES

Both eighteen-day semester courses and thirty-six-day annual courses are offered. Chesapeake residents will be charged \$67.50 for an eighteen-day course and \$135.00 for a thirty-six day course. Non-Chesapeake residents will be charged \$167.50 for an eighteen-day course and \$335.00 for a thirty-six-day course.

### CREDIT-BEARING REPEAT COURSES

Certain courses will be offered on a repeat basis for students who have attempted, but not completed successfully, a particular course. The amount of class time required for repeat courses is one-half the class time required for the initial attempt. Chesapeake residents will be charged \$67.50 for an eighteen-day repeat class and non-Chesapeake residents will be charged \$167.50 for an eighteen-day repeat course. A student may take two courses if permission is obtained from his or her principal.

The final decision on student eligibility for a repeat course is made by the home school principal.

### SENIOR COURSES

English classes and repeat government classes are offered in the afternoon for seniors who need two credits for graduation in summer school. Students will have to provide their own transportation home after the afternoon classes.

### REGULATIONS

The usual regulations on attendance, tardiness, and smoking will apply to summer school students. Students who have excessive absences will be dropped from classes. Specific attendance details will be discussed with students by the summer school principals. In the event a student is dropped for poor attendance, no refund of tuition will be made.

**Students will not be excused to attend conferences nor leave summer school early for vacation, and no early final tests will be permitted.**

Since participation at summer school is not mandatory, students who present discipline problems within the classroom, in the school, or on school grounds will not be permitted to continue in attendance. No student dismissed for disciplinary reasons will be entitled to any refunds or reduction of tuition.

### TRANSPORTATION

**Limited** bus transportation will be provided for summer school students to the schools hosting summer school. (See Basic Information) Express buses will run from the Western Branch, Deep Creek/Oscar Smith, and Hickory/Great Bridge areas to Indian River High School. Students riding these buses should board the bus at established stops along the route. The bus schedules will be published in the Virginia Pilot Clipper prior to summer school and distributed to all schools. Students attending the Superintendent's Gifted and Enrichment Series will be afforded bus transportation to and from the Center for Science and Technology via a shuttle from the summer school site in their attending area.

### HOW TO REGISTER

Chesapeake Public School middle and senior high school students should contact their school counselors for help in registration beginning April 21, 2008. Every student must register and pay for summer school at the school he/she regularly attends. No student will be permitted to register at the summer school sites other than those students who normally attend those schools. Registration, including payment, should be completed by noon on June 10. After June 10, students must continue to register at the school they regularly attend, but pay at the summer school site they will attend. Registration will be conducted at the summer school locations on Monday, June 23, 2008. For SOL *Quick Review* classes, it is still necessary for students to obtain a registration form at the school they regularly attend.

Chesapeake residents who are not currently enrolled in a Chesapeake school may register beginning June 16 at the summer school site. A permission letter indicating courses desired is required from the sending school's administration. Proof of residency is also required (water, gas, or electric bill).

Non-Chesapeake residents may register on June 23 **ONLY** at the summer school site on a space-available basis. A permission letter, indicating courses desired is required from the sending school's administration. If you are a VA public

school student, the appropriate form with your student number is needed to take a SOL credit-bearing course.

### DRIVER EDUCATION

Locations: Indian River High School, Hickory Middle School, and Deep Creek High School for classroom instruction. Behind the Wheel instructions will be at all high schools.

### Student Eligibility:

1. Completion of tenth-grade physical education
2. Failure in previous driver education class
3. Recent transfer students who have completed tenth-grade physical education.

### Registration:

Registration for Chesapeake Public School students **must** be completed in the student's home school. Non-Chesapeake Public School students (**Chesapeake residents only**) must register through the Office of Driver Education (547-0153, ext. 155).

**Cost:** The cost is \$75.00 for those students taking the classroom phase and \$75.00 for the behind-the-wheel experience. The cost of all phases is \$150.00.

### MUSIC PROGRAM

#### HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Music Department of the Chesapeake Public Schools provides summer programs for high school band, chorus, and orchestra students at their home schools. These tuition-free programs are designed and facilitated by the music faculty at each high school. Students may contact their school's band, chorus, or orchestra teacher for information regarding activities and schedules for the various programs.

In addition, a jazz studies program will be offered this summer for rising 10<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup>-grade band students. Information will be distributed to all eligible students. There will be a small fee to cover materials and supplies. High school choral students may opt to participate in the Summer Choral Academy, for which there is a small fee. Information regarding this activity will be made available to all eligible students.

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

Middle school students are invited to participate in the Chesapeake Public Schools Summer Music Academies which are held at three summer school sites. There is a small fee to cover the cost of materials and supplies. Middle school music teachers will distribute detailed information to all eligible students. (In some cases, membership is limited to a specific grade level or levels.)

### SOL QUICK REVIEW

SOL review courses will be offered for students who need additional assistance prior to re-taking a SOL end-of-course test. To be eligible to take a SOL *QUICK REVIEW* course, a student must have passed the related SOL course by receiving a standard unit of credit in the course. SOL *QUICK REVIEW* courses will be offered in English in reading/literature and writing, Algebra I, Geometry, Earth Science, Biology, and United States History. Students will take the SOL end-of-course test at the conclusion of the review course.
