2008 SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

BASIC INFORMATION

For students in grades 6-8 who are scheduled to go to Jolliff Middle School for summer school, the first session will begin Monday, June 23, 2008. The second session will begin July 21, 2008. Courses are designed for eighteen days; the complete schedule is listed on the back of this page. Classes meet 8:00-12:00 each weekday. July 4th will be observed as a holiday; therefore, schools will be closed. Schools will also be closed July 18th.

MIDDLE SCHOOL COURSES

Students who are Chesapeake residents and need courses in sixth, seventh, or eighth-grade English, mathematics, science, or social studies may take the courses at no cost. Non-Chesapeake residents will be charged \$167.50* per course. Each sixth-, seventh-, or eighth-grade class will meet for eighteen days. A student may take two courses if permission is obtained from his or her principal. To be eligible to repeat a sixth, seventh, or eighth-grade class, a student must have made an "E." A student who made a "D" must have the permission of his or her school principal. The final decision on student eligibility for a repeat course is made by the home school principal.

REGULATIONS

The usual regulations on attendance, tardiness, and smoking will apply to summer school students. Parents and students need to be aware of the attendance and discipline policy and how the student can be affected. As during the regular school session, we are governed by school board policy that requires the student to attend the current session for a minimum number of days. If the student fails to meet these requirements, they may not receive a passing grade for that session. In the summer session this requirement means that a student cannot miss more than four days.

Students will not be excused to attend conferences nor leave summer school early for vacation, and early final tests will not be permitted.

Since participation at summer school is not mandatory, students who present discipline problems within the classroom, in the school, or on school grounds will not be permitted to continue in attendance. Students dismissed for disciplinary reasons will not be entitled to any refund or reduction of tuition.

TRANSPORTATION

Limited bus transportation will be provided for summer school students to Jolliff Middle School, Indian River High School, and The Chesapeake Center for Science and Technology only. The bus schedules will be distributed at all schools before the end of the year. The Virginia Pilot Clipper will publish summer school bus schedules the week prior to the beginning of summer school.

HOW TO REGISTER

The Chesapeake Public School System is an equal educational opportunity school system. The School Board of the City of Chesapeake also adheres to the principles of equal opportunity in employment and, therefore, prohibits discrimination in terms and conditions of employment on the basis of race, sex, national origin, color, religion, age, or disability.

Middle school students should contact their guidance counselors for help in registration beginning April 21, 2008. Students should register and pay for summer school at the school where they regularly attend until June 10th. After that date, students must continue to register at the school they regularly attend and then pay at the appropriate summer school location. Registration will also be conducted at the summer school locations on Monday, June 23. Chesapeake residents who do not attend Chesapeake Public Schools may register beginning on June 16. Proof of residency is also required (water, gas, or electric bill). Non-Chesapeake residents may register on June 23 ONLY.

MUSIC PROGRAM

Middle school students are invited to participate in the Chesapeake Public Schools Summer Music Academies which are held at three summer school sites. There is a small fee to cover the cost of materials and supplies. Middle school music teachers will distribute detailed information to all eligible students.

(In some cases, membership is limited to a specific grade level or levels.)
