2011 SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

BASIC INFORMATION

Summer school will begin Monday, June 27, 2011 for students in grades 9-12. All courses are designed for thirty days. The complete schedule is listed on the back of this page. **The courses will only be offered if there is sufficient enrollment.**

Classes meet 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Schools will be closed on Fridays. Schools will also be closed on Monday, July 4, 2011. Graduation for summer school will be held August 17, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. in the Oscar Smith High School auditorium.

HIGH SCHOOL

CREDIT-BEARING COURSES

Chesapeake residents will be charged \$300.00 for a thirty-day course.

Non-Chesapeake residents will be charged \$600.00 for a thirty-day course.

SENIOR COURSES

English 12 and government classes are offered online for seniors who need two credits for graduation in summer school.

REGULATIONS

The usual regulations on attendance and tardiness will apply to summer school students. A student shall not be granted credit if absences total more than three days for a thirty-day class. Students who have excessive absences will be dropped from classes. Specific attendance details will be discussed with students by the summer school principal. In the event a student is dropped for poor attendance, no refund of tuition will be made.

Students will not be excused to attend conferences or leave summer school early for vacation, and no early final tests will be permitted.

Since participation at summer school is not mandatory, students who present discipline problems within the classroom, in the school, or on school grounds will not be permitted to continue in attendance. No student dismissed for disciplinary reasons will

be entitled to any refunds or reduction of tuition.

TRANSPORTATION

Limited bus transportation will be provided for summer school students to Oscar Smith High School. The bus schedules can be viewed on the Chesapeake Public Schools website the week prior to the beginning of summer school.

HOW TO REGISTER

Chesapeake Public Schools high school students should contact their school counselors for help in registration beginning May 2, 2011. Every student must register and pay for summer school at the school he/she regularly attends. No student will be permitted to register at the summer school site other than those students who normally attend Oscar Smith High School. Registration, including payment, should be completed by June 16 at their home school. Registration will be conducted at Oscar Smith High School from June 20 – June 23, 2011; however, it is necessary for students to obtain a registration form at the school they regularly attend before registering at the summer school site. This includes SOL Quick Review.

Chesapeake residents who are not currently enrolled in a Chesapeake school may register for high school classes beginning June 20 at Oscar Smith High School. A permission letter indicating courses desired is required from the sending school's administration. Proof of residency is also required (water, gas, or electric bill).

Non-Chesapeake residents may register on June 27 ONLY at Oscar Smith High School on a space-available basis. A permission letter, indicating courses desired is required from the sending school's administration. If you are a Virginia public school student, the appropriate form with your student number is needed to take an SOL credit-bearing course.

DRIVER EDUCATION

Locations: Oscar Smith High School

will have classroom instruction. Behind the Wheel instruction will be at all high schools.

Student Eligibility:

1. Completion of tenth-grade physical education
2. Failure in previous driver education class
3. Recent transfer students who have completed tenth-grade physical education.

Registration:

Registration for Chesapeake Public School students **must** be completed in the student's home school. Non-Chesapeake Public School students (**Chesapeake residents only**) must register through the Office of Driver Education (547-0153, ext. 510155).

Cost: The cost is \$75.00 for those students taking the classroom phase and \$200.00 for the behind-the-wheel experience. The cost of both phases is \$275.00.

Driver Education will have two sessions:

June 27 – July 21

July 25 – August 17

SOL QUICK REVIEW

SOL review courses will be offered for students who need additional assistance prior to re-taking an SOL end-of-course test. To be eligible to take an SOL **QUICK REVIEW** course, a student must have passed the related SOL course by receiving a standard unit of credit in the course. SOL **QUICK REVIEW** courses will be offered in English in reading/literature and writing, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, World History & Geography I, World History & Geography II, VA & U.S. History, Earth Science, Biology, and Chemistry. Students will take the SOL end-of-course test at the conclusion of the review course.
